Verses




“He must be baptized and born again at the name of the Holy Trinity, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit”. Matthew 28:19

This is an image that describes how we, Orthodox Christians, see the Holy Trinity. The Father is not The Son, The Son is not the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit is not The Father, but they are all One God.

The Holy Trinity



The Father

- The Father is the source or origin of the Holy Trinity.
- When we pray, we pray to the Father and He listens to us.

The Holy Trinity



The Son

- The Son has His divine nature because he was begotten of the Father.
- The Son, Jesus, is not just divine, and not just human; He is both.

The Holy Trinity




The Holy Spirit

- Unlike the Son, the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father alone.
- The Father still gives the same divine nature to both the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- We do NOT believe that the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son (Catholic Church)

Examples

SUN

- Sun is Father
- Light is Jesus
- Heat is Holy Spirit



Examples

MAN

- **Existence (body), gives him a mind, working by his spirit.**



Coptic Orthodox Doctrine



In our Coptic Orthodox doctrine we believe that Jesus was human divine “His humanity and divinity didn't part away for a single moment or a twinkle of an eye” from the moment that ArchAngel Gabriel's annunciation to the Virgin Mary till Jesus death on the cross. (Jesus holding 1 finger representing his 1 nature -God incarnated in the flesh)
