





The Book of Revelations

When was it written?

- 95-96 AD
- It's considered to be the core of the church rituals. (bowing down, lights, and brightness)
- It's mainly written in symbols and the events are presented in a way without being concerned with the time.
- It's the only prophetic book in the New Testament.
- St. John wrote the book of revelations while in captivity in Patmos (a greek island where they were persecuting Christians under the Roman emperor Domitian), he was exiled there.

1: God

" ... And having turned I saw seven golden lampstands, and in the midst of the seven lamp-stands One like the son of man clothed with a garment down to the feet and girded about the chest with a golden band. His head and hair were white like wool, as white as snow, and eyes like a flame of fire; His feet were like fine brass, as if refined in a furnace, and His voice as the sound of many waters; He had in His right hand seven stars, out of His mouth went a sharp two-edged sword, and His countenance was like the sun shining in its strength." (Rev. 1:12-17)



2-3: The Seven Churches

Ephesus: abandoned its love for Christ and his teachings.

Smyrna: remained faithful amidst persecution.

Pergamos: compromised its beliefs, and needs

to repent.

Thyatira: adultery, sexual immorality.

Sardis: hypocrisy & spiritually dead.

Philadelphia: patiently endured despite weaknesses.

Laodicea: lukewarm faith.

Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent.

4: The Divine Throne

- 7. The Earth Utterly Shaken (before the judgement)






18: The Fall of Babylon

What does Babylon Symbolize?

- Sin & Rebellion

"Thus with violence the great city Babylon shall be thrown down, and shall not be found anymore." (Rev. 18:21)

"For your merchants were the great men of the earth, or by your sorcery all the nations were deceived. And in her was found the blood of prophets and saints, and of all who were slain on the earth." (Rev. 18:23-24)

"Then I, John, saw the holy city, New Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband.
