- **Social** --- By participating in the Scouting Path, youth begin to understand how they depend on others, and how others depend on them. The scouting service allows them to be part of a diverse group and develop cooperation and leadership skills.
- Physical--- The scouting Path provides many opportunities for youth to be responsible for the care
  development and wellbeing of their bodies.
- Intellectual---Through the Scouting Path, youth have opportunities to develop their abilities to think, to plan, to innovate and to use information in an original way.
- Character --- The Scouting Path guides youth to take responsibility for themselves while still respecting the needs of others, helping them to create a lifelong, personal values system.
- Emotional --- Through The Scouting Path, youth members are given opportunities to recognize
  and respect their own feelings and to express them in a healthy manner while respecting the
  feelings of others.
- **Spiritual** --- Youth members have experiences that help them recognize that they are part of a larger spiritual reality and learn to respect the spiritual choices of others.
